



283. SCRIMSHAW WHALE TOOTH, mid 19th Century, engraved with a full portrait of a lady in formal dress holding a floral branch and handkerchief, the reverse with a potted flowering tree. Height 6 in.



284. SCRIMSHAW WHALE TOOTH, early 19th Century, engraved with a portrait of Napoleon with flags, swords, cannon, and the reverse with an officer courting a young lady. Height 6 ½ in.
